TIME POVERTY

AND WOMEN IN THE WORKPLACE

Discretionary time refers to time in the day that is not committed to an essential task and can be applied to studies, self-care, etc. A lack of discretionary time is called "Time Poverty".

Non-discretionary time is inaccessible for studying or career advancement. Time Poverty is a chief contributor to poor educational outcomes and career stagnation. The factors that cause Time Poverty disproportionately affect women.

Housework & family chores
